

# Creditors want former CEO to testify and produce evidence

Those that are owed money by Humboldt Creamery want to hear directly from former CEO Rich Ghilarducci what happened.

A request has been submitted to the bankruptcy court by the unse-

cured creditors to allow an oral examination of the former CEO who now resides in Arizona.

The creditors want the court to “compel” Ghilarducci to show up on July 1 to the Eureka law offices of

Bill Bertain and bring with him any documents, emails, diaries, records of conversations, appointment books, among a myriad of other requests.

Specifically, the creditors want any documents re-

lating to transfers from accounts held by the former CEO or transfers from creamery accounts to Ghilarducci, since January 1, 2003. They also want to see any documents relating to agreements between the

creamery and/or banks and Ghilarducci and any documents showing communication with the banks. They are also requesting documents showing Ghilarducci’s communications with auditors as well as

an alleged payment of \$200,000 by Ghilarducci to the creamery for alleged payroll obligations.

Efforts to reach Ghilarducci’s attorney for comment were unsuccessful.
